


Side (upper drawing) and top (middle drawing) views of an atlat! or spear thrower from Broken Roof Cave in northeastern Arizona. The atlat! was made of oak with finger-loops of animal hide. A groove or notch in the end of the atlat! (middle drawing) helped to hold the spear in position and the stone added weight and increased the force of the throw. The lower drawing shows how the atlat! was held in the hand.



Paleo-Indians used the atlat! to hunt large animals. Use of the atlat! following the steps illustrated increased the power and thrust of the spear. Experiments have shown that this weapon is capable of mortally wounding large animals such as elephants.
